About Our Program

The Schweiger Memorial Scholarship Fund was founded in 1999 in honor of Forrest and Konrad Schweiger after their untimely passing by Advanced American Construction; a full-service general contractor providing heavy civil, marine, industrial, diving, and engineering services to public and private clients throughout the western United States. This scholarship program aims to advance the education and career goals of outstanding students and apprentices in the construction and engineering industry in the Pacific Northwest.

In addition to an academic scholarship, the fund offers a trade apprenticeship scholarship sponsored by the International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) and the United Brotherhood of Carpenters (UBC); as well as a veteran scholarship sponsored by the Ashback Family for students who are currently serving, or have served, in any branch of the US Military. Scholarship recipients are awarded up to \$7,000, and applicants are eligible to receive scholarships for each year they meet qualifying criteria.

The Schweiger Memorial Scholarship Fund also offers a paid summer internship program with opportunities from leading construction and engineering companies in the Pacific Northwest. This program provides practical construction experience for students and apprentices, and priority for scholarship consideration is given to the internship participants.

The scholarship selection committee consists of representatives from our internship sponsoring companies as well as educators, trade union leaders, and industry professionals. This committee reviews applicants based on their achievements and goals and the scholarships are presented to these outstanding students and apprentices at the Annual Schweiger Memorial Scholarship Awards and Celebration each spring.

Thanks to contributions from Advanced American Construction's customers, vendors, employees, and friends over the last 20 years, the Schweiger Memorial Scholarship Fund has awarded 238 scholarships totaling \$730,000 to outstanding students pursuing degrees and careers in construction and engineering-related fields.
